

WINDOWS BASED PRESENTATION GRAPHICS

TUTORIAL PRESENTATION

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Instruction using computer-based presentation graphics is an effective way to present visual material. Windows-based presentation software, such as Aldus Persuasion or Powerpoint by Microsoft and others, offer the instructor a quick, dynamic, and cost effective way of communicating information.

Windows-based presentation software permits the instructor to prepare not only class visuals, but lecture notes, and handouts keyed to the visuals thus encouraging student attentiveness. Other options, such preview, give the instructor maximum flexibility in customizing presentations, easy updating of material, and an expeditious way to view and modify the entire presentation.

This tutorial will focus on Aldus Persuasion v2.0 for Windows. A presentation will be developed incorporating special effects, color, and slide customization. Persuasion's ability to create handouts and notes, and will also be demonstrated. Finally, the editing features of Persuasion will be illustrated.
